Monday 10 April

Phoebe Physics- Spin that Toy

With a flick of your wrist, a twist of the stick or a soft blow, you can make these toys spin. Ever wanted to build working toys from straws, paper plates and old CDs?- then this is your workshop. In this introductory physics workshop we will take everyday items and turn them into spinning toys while exploring what force makes the movement possible.

Tuesday 11 April

Beebot SOS
